Bring Us ALL of Your Batteries for Recycling

The Solid Waste Agency now accepts ALL batteries for recycling. Drop them off in the Resource Recovery Building at 1954 County Home Road in Marion. The collection includes ALL battery types and sizes – alkaline, rechargeable, button, lithium and lead-acid.

If not disposed of properly, many batteries can spark fires or explosions. Some batteries contain hazardous chemicals that can be harmful to your family and pets. If landfilled, these batteries can contaminate land and waterways.





A new budget year for the Solid Waste Agency will begin July 1, 2025, and includes increases to garbage and yard waste tipping fees.

Rates Changing July 1, 2025

Standard Landfill

\$50.00/ton (increase of \$2/ton) Minimum \$22

Yard & Wood Waste

\$32.00/ton (increase of \$2/ton) Minimum \$15

Yard Waste & Organics Drop-off ONLY at A Street SW Location

A friendly reminder that yard waste is only accepted at the Solid Waste Agency compost location – 2250 A Street SW, Cedar Rapids.

This is where yard waste, food waste, tree debris and other organic materials are processed into compost or wood chips.

Yard waste drop off is NOT allowed at the 1954 County Home Road location in Marion since it cannot be processed at this facility.

Most communities in Linn County offer yard waste collection or operate a yard waste drop-off area for resident use. The table at right outlines these services. Contact your community's city hall for your yard waste drop-off location or more detailed information.

You must schedule an appointment to use the landfill or Resource Recovery building (1954 County Home Road, Marion) on a Saturday. Appointments are not needed Monday through Friday as there is less traffic congestion.

If you do not have an appointment or commercial account when visiting on a Saturday, *you will be turned away.*

Mount Trashmore Re-Opens in the Spring

Trails will open when weather permits.

As a closed landfill, Mount Trashmore is a regulated site, which means access cannot be unrestricted. The goal is to give visitors as much access as possible.

Check-In Process

Since Mount Trashmore is a regulated and permitted waste management site, visitors are required to check in at kiosks located inside Recreation Building 948.

After checking in for the first time, you may choose to have a QR code sent to your mobile device. On your next visit, simply scan your code for quick check-in.

A new check-in and code will be required each spring at the beginning of a new season.



Reminder of what CANNOT be recycled in Linn County. Go ahead and throw these materials in the garbage!



Not All Materials Can Be Recycled

Recycling is market-driven. Anything could be recycled IF there is a demand for that product. Unfortunately, recycling markets have decreased in recent years.

Recycle symbols DO NOT guarantee it's recyclable

This symbol indicates the type of plastic used to make the product. For instance, Styrofoam and red picnic cups are both a number 6 made from low-density polystyrene. There is no market for recycling this type of plastic in Linn County.

What happens if I try to recycle something that is NOT recyclable? Unaccepted items in the

Unaccepted items in the recycling stream can contaminate an entire load of materials. Recycling processing centers reject loads that contain non-accepted items. If rejected, the materials are trucked back to the landfill for disposal. This added time and fuel consumption increases the overall costs for recycling.

Keep non-accepted materials out of the recycling stream!

Make your recycling and waste reduction efforts count!

- 1 Make sure items to be recycled are **empty, clean, and dry!**
- 2 Choose reusable grocery bags and water bottles.
- **3** Limit your use of single-use disposable items. For instance, decline a straw or lid on your drink when dining in.
- 4 Purchase reusable durable cookware such as glass or metal pie plates and roasting pans.
- **5** Packaging materials are a large part of our waste stream. Be aware of the amount of packaging an item has and consider similar items with less packaging.

Cover Your Load!

An uncovered load like this will be fined at the Solid Waste Agency.

The Solid Waste Agency wants to make sure all roads leading to the landfill are safe and clean. That is why loads entering the Agency must be covered or secured. Pickups and trailers need to have a tarp over them. Garbage and dump trucks, too. Loads with bulky items like couches and mattresses need to be tied down securely.

Uncovered or unsecured loads will be fined up to \$50 at the scale house. If you are pulled over by law enforcement on the way to the landfill for material blowing or falling from your vehicle, you can receive a ticket for more than \$360!

Stay safe and save your money by covering and securing your load!

- Flat Rates for Personal Vehicles
 Cars \$12/vehicle
 SUVs, Crossovers, Wagons, Minivans \$15/vehicle
 Pickup Trucks, Full-Size Vans \$22/vehicle
- Box Trucks, Cargo Vans \$50 minimum; will be weighed, includes U-Haul, Ryder, Penske trucks.
- Bulky Loads \$80 per ton, see list on website
- Mattresses \$20 ea. (separate charge from garbage tonnage/flat rates)
- Loads may be weighed at scale house discretion.
- Tipping fee doubles for loads containing recyclable cardboard; fines issued for other banned materials.
- All loads must be covered and secured. Fine for noncompliance: \$25 residential/\$100 commercial.
- Payment due at time of service cash, credit/debit card, or business check.
- Yard waste, brush & tree debris NOT accepted at this location.

- Accepts commercial loads, all trailer loads, and any size residential loads.
- Brush, tree limbs, stumps less than 12" diameter, plant/grass clippings, leaves, Christmas trees.
